## *A Note from the Director:*

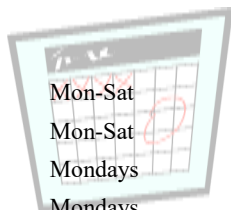

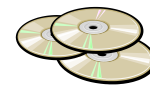

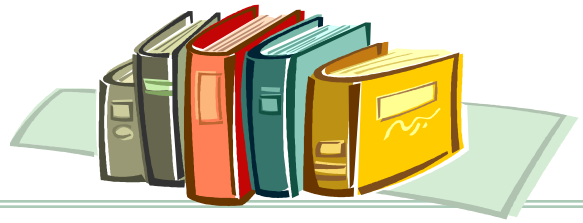
